Celebrations Around the World!



Also known as the Festival of Lights, festivities include singing songs, reading scripture and lighting candles on a Menorah.



Held at the start of November, this festival is a time to think about family who have passed away. Decorated skulls made of sugar or chocolate are given to as gifts



This is a five day Hindu festival in which rituals include worshipping, singing, dancing and feasts. People make an offering of rice to crows (the messengers of death).



For many people this five-day festival honours Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. Celebrations include spring cleaning your home, firework displays and exchanging gifts.



This festival begins at the first sighting of the new moon. It's a tradition to wear new clothes and on the way to the mosque. to eat something sweet, and recite a short prayer.



Celebrated over 5 days, this festival celebrates the arrival of Spring and is seen as a time for forgiveness. Celebrants smear each other with paint and coloured water!



The main ritual associated with the festival is mamemaki (bean scattering) This sees "fortune beans" thrown out of the front door, or at someone wearing an oni (demon or ogre) mask while shouting "Devils out! Fortune in!"
